Did you know?

If you are a 21st Century Scholar or qualify for the lunch program, your guidance counselor can waive one ACT and one SAT test fee both your junior and senior year of high school. In addition, you can have all college application fees waived next year.

Juniors:

You are eligible for one day of release time this school year to take a college visit.

Get Ready Academically

- 1. Hit the books! Your course schedule should include college prep classes. Take challenging courses if you can—including AP and dual credit classes, when available and appropriate
- 2. Take the Tests! Register to take the SAT, the ACT or both during the spring of your junior year.

Explore Schools and Careers

- 1. Research schools! It's time to start comparing schools and figuring out where you want to apply.
- Visit College Campuses. Try to visit a college when classes are in session. That way, you can get a feeling for campus life, talk to students, meet professors and staff, attend a class, and even sample the campus cuisine. School websites usually list visit dates.

Cover the Costs!

- 1. Research Financial Aid: Loans, grants, aid—all are forms of financial aid. Learn the differences and how you might qualify (if you haven't already).
- 2. Seek out Scholarships: Start searching for scholarship opportunities. Save copies of your scholarship applications and essays so you can use them on each of your applications.
