ast Central High School and the Sunman Dearborn Community Schools recently received from the State of Indiana school grades for the 2013-14 school year. Not only did ALL the schools in the corporation receive an "A" for efforts; but, for the third year in a row, East Central High School received an "A." This grade reflects passing rates on our end-of-course assessments for Math and Language Arts as well as perfect scores in graduation rates and college and career readiness.

Some interesting statistics about East Central High School include the following:

- Out of 2166 schools (all elementary, middle and high schools) listed in this year's State results, 861 received a 4.0... we are one of them. (top 40%)
- Out of 2166 schools listed in this year's State results, 426 <u>received an "A" for the last three years in a row....</u> we are one of them. (top 20%)
- ◆ Out of 487 <u>HIGH SCHOOLS</u> listed in this year's State results, 79 got a 4.0... we are one of them. (top 16%)
- ♦ 58 <u>HIGH SCHOOLS</u> in the state <u>maintained an "A" for the last three straight</u> years... we are one of them.





Another component of Renaissance Learning that EC uses is STAR Reading. STAR assessments are computer-adaptive tests designed to give accurate, reliable, and valid data quickly so teachers can make informed decisions about instruction and intervention. STAR Reading Enterprise is an enhanced version that includes skills-based test items, learning progressions for in-

structional planning, and in-depth reports. The English department gives the STAR test several times during the school year to monitor and track student progress in reading and literacy.



Others have suggested that he merely wanted political stability (with reforms coming once stability had been achieved). Still others saw his work as an early attempt to recommend the separation of Church and State, or as a clever expose on political corruption. Some have even suggested satire. 
* When neither their property nor their honor is touched, the majority of men live content.

- * There is no other way of guarding oneself against flattery than by letting men understand that they will not offend you by speaking the truth; but when everyone can tell you the truth, you lose their
